

LEGALISATION OF DOCUMENTS - THE HAGUE APOSTILLE

Public documents issued in the UK which need to be legalised for use in Spain are covered by the 1961 Hague Convention which abolished the requirement for legalisation of public documents and to which Spain became a signatory in 1978.

The Consulate-General can forward to London most British public documents which need the Apostille.
